Presenters

Dr. Carman Timmerman is a 43 year veteran of nursing who has worked in a variety of medical-surgical, surgical, PACU, academic and performance improvement venues. Carman has a long-standing interest in evidence based practice and has previously presented on this topic to healthcare organizations.

Dr. James Keegan Chief Medical Officer overseeing quality care at Regional Health. He is also Chief Executive Officer for Regional Health Physicians and Board Certified in Infectious Disease and Internal Medicine. Medical Director of Infection Control and Medical Director of Antibiotic Management team. He received his medical degree from Emory University. He is a Clinical Consultant with the SD Dept. of Health. Currently an assistant clinical professor at the USD School of Medicine.

Randee Hancock, RN, BSN is the Director of Clinical Integration for the Regional Health System in Western SD. Her current area of focus is assisting with the integration of clinical processes focusing on standardization and seamless patient care throughout the Regional Health system. Her clinical integration coordinator responsibilities include but are not limited to evidence based best practice projects such as blood product stewardship across Regional Health, coordination of a region wide ST Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) response program, as well as, standardization of evidence based practice from clinic to hospital to nursing home.
