MPHC ceased satellite programming broadcasts in June 2006. We continued to capture satellite programs and archive them on the MPHC website (www.heds.org) as video-streams that are available to members generally within 72 hours of the program. Web based education increased dramatically during FY 06, with the financial assistance of the Archibald Bush Foundation Grant of \$54,000. In FY 06 we added an additional 30 plus web based programs, and through the capture of satellite programming, we were able to digitize and archive over 200 video streams.
